COMPUTATIONS AND MECHANISMS OF DECISION MAKING AND COGNITIVE CONTROL

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Successful goal-directed behavior requires organisms to continuously update their beliefs and adjust their actions in response to changing environmental demands. This capacity for flexible adaptation—classically referred to as cognitive control—operates across multiple timescales.

In this talk, I will report on a series of complementary studies that examine adaptive control across computational, neural, pharmacological, and clinical levels of analysis.
