

Leibniz Lecture

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In her lecture, she will present her current work on how the brain responds to stress. The focus is on the role of neuropeptide Y in stress responses and memory. Using models of early stress, she will show how stress can cause long-term changes in the networks of the hippocampus during important periods of development. This will show how neuropeptide Y affects the way we remember fear, how our brain changes when we learn, and how we react to different situations.

The findings make important contributions to the understanding of the neurobiological basis of anxiety disorders and open up perspectives for translational approaches.
